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2. Introduction

This Summary Quality Report provides detailed background information on the Teacher Workforce Data tables published by the Department of Education & Youth on the Central Statistics Office's (CSO) PxStat Open Data platform. These tables are based on data from the DEY and ETB's payroll systems, and the Teaching Council registration datasets. They provide data on teacher workforce counts in Irish schools funded by the state. The data is sourced by the Department of Education and Youth. This data is also used along with school data from the Primary Online Database (POD) and the Post Primary Online Database (PPOD) datasets in the "Workforce Data Bulletin" which is published by DEY annually.

5. Statistical Presentation

5.1. Data Description

The teacher workforce data tables consist of a total count of whole-time equivalent teachers broken down by contract type and school sector. They are presented on PX Stat as full time equivalent of full time or parttime teacher counts by school sector. They are further broken down by school type within each sector. The DEY annual publication tables also include total counts grouped by county or ETB level.

5.2. Classification System

The three main classifications used are School Sector, School Type, Full Time Equivalent (FTE).

School sector is Primary or Post Primary.

School Type is the type of Primary or Post Primary school grouping for example: "Ordinary with special classes" primary school or "Vocational" post primary school.

The FTE is a calculation of the total full time equivalent teachers. If a teacher only works half a school week, they are counted as 0.5 FTE, if they work full time they are counted as 1 FTE. FTEs are first calculated at school level, distinguished by their PPSN and the school's unique Roll Number. They are not published at this level. Calculations are aggregated to county level for DEY annual publication and "School Type" level for PX Stat publications.

5.3. Sector Coverage

Data covers all primary and post primary teachers who are paid by the Department of Education and Youth or ETBs and who are contracted in Primary (including Special Schools) or Post Primary schools funded by the state. Teachers who work in private schools are counted where their salary is paid by the Department of Education and Youth.

12. Relevance

12.1. User Needs

There is considerable interest in Teacher Supply and Demand in Ireland. Publishing actual teacher FTEs for both DEY and ETB schools gives policy makers, media and other education stakeholders integral information regarding our teacher workforce.

12.2. Data Completeness

13. Accuracy and reliability

The main data source for this publication are administrative datasets. These datasets record individuals who have been paid or have paid a salary or registration fee and therefore the data is extremely accurate and reliable. Data is taken from these sources at multiple times throughout the year to allow for checking and verification. The business teams who produce the datasets carry out both technical and operational checks prior to providing the data to the statistics team, who in turn carry out their own verification.

14. Timeliness and punctuality

Data for the school year will be published during the current school year so there will be no lag.

15. Coherence & Comparability

Data will be grouped by county or ETB level on the DEY Workforce data bulletin.

16.2. Data Revision Practice

If an error is identified in the workforce data publication or PxStat tables after they have been published, it will be revised as quickly as possible. The corrected figure will be double-checked and Table updated. A



note will be added to the Table on PxStat and on the Department's site indicating the correction and the date when the revised data was published.

17. Statistical processing

17.1. Source Type

Data is based on administrative datasets.

17.2. Data Collection.

17.2.1. Data Capture

Payroll Data – Athlone Payroll – Secure file transfer
Teaching Council Register – Teaching Council – Secure file transfer
ETB Payroll – Education Shared Business Services – Secure file transfer
POD/PPOD school data – POD/PPOD databases BI

17.3. Data Validation

All datasets are checked by appropriate technical teams to ensure technical extraction was carried out successfully, for example data integrity and completeness and data quality.

The operational teams then check actual contents of files to ensure correctness, for example comparisons to previous extractions and spot checks on individual entries. When they are confident that the files are accurate, they transfer to the statistics team.

The statistics team carry out their own checks on the files to ensure transfer was successfully completed with no errors. They also pseudonymise the data to ensure no individual can be identified. The files are stored in folders with restricted access.

The aggregate data is developed using R. The aggregate data is validated by the statistics team.

17.4. Data Compilation

Operations are performed on data to derive new information according to a given set of rules.

Each entry in the payroll files has an associated unique PPSN and either a school Roll Number or in the case of ETB schools a Cost Centre number. Roll numbers and Cost Centre numbers are unique to each school. The full time equivalent (FTE) value per PPSN is calculated. Then using the roll number/cost centre and the FTE value associated with each PPSN, total full time estimates per school are calculated.

Teaching Council data is used to verify teacher types in ETB schools to distinguish post primary teachers from other teaching staff.

POD and PPOD data is used to add additional school data to the calculations e.g.: school type, DEIS, Irish Medium School etc. POD/PPOD data is also used to check the open/closed status of the school. Longitude and latitude values are gathered using the school address data from these databases to allow for geographical mapping of results.



Aggregates are calculated by various groupings, contract types, school types, FTE verses allocated posts. All aggregates are dependent on the original FTE per PPSN calculation.

Results are compared to previous time periods and time series are recorded for this reason.
